<p>The Figure In Clay*</p> <p><i>Alice Manzi</i> Tuition: \$395 Thu 7 – 9pm Materials Fee: \$75</p> <p>A studio course for adults in figure modeling with ceramic clay. The course will explore methods and aesthetics of creating figurative sculpture. Instruction will be provided in proportion, anatomy, features of the face, etc. Students will work from the model each week, putting into practice the techniques they have learned.</p>	<p>Exploring Raku*</p> <p><i>Jill Kovachick</i> Tuition: \$360 Sat 10am – 12pm Materials Fee: \$75</p> <p>Explore and learn the process of Raku. The student will learn various methods and techniques associated with glazes and slips. Surface treatment will vary depending on the firing. Group critiques are held each week to review and enhance concept and visual imagery. The wheel will be optional and available to everyone. Other weeks will include clay mask making, beads and small figures, and slab vessels. Projects will be fun and also allow for in-depth understanding of the materials.</p>	<p>Wheel Boot Camp Grades 6-12</p> <p>Curtis Fontaine Tuition: \$190 Thursdays (6 weeks) 3:30 – 5:00 pm</p> <p>Learn the basic fundamental techniques for throwing pots on the wheel. No experience (just patience) required. Create functional pieces such as bowls, cups, mugs and vases. Learn about surface decoration, glazing and firing. Have fun after a hard days work at school. Members receive 10% discount. Sibling enrollment receives 10% discount.</p>
